## Minor English and American Studies (2013 examination regulations)

Minor students have to acquire a total of 54 credit points (CPs). They have to take 6 exams.

## 1<sup>st</sup> Year:

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For the Language Skills I Module students must acquire certificates of attendance in the following classes: *Grammar I, Grammar II, Translation for Beginners, Vocabulary and Translation*

Basic Module II	Linguistics	2 x 2 SWS + 1 AP	6 CP
Basic Module III	Literary Studies	2 X 2 SWS + 1 AP	6 CP

Students must pick two of the three basic modules. For the remainder of their studies, they may only take classes from the corresponding departments. Intermediate and Advanced modules must only be taken and passed in those fields.

The Language Skills I and Basic Modules I-III must be finished with a final exam.

In order to be admitted into the *intermediate module* classes the students must pass the according *basic modules* first.

The classes for the advanced modules can be chosen from the linguistics and literary studies departments.

Admission to the *Advanced Modules* requires that the student has passed the according intermediate module, i.e. a student may only take an advanced module in literary studies if they have passed an intermediate module in literary studies.

## The total sum of credit points should 54 CP.

Exams in the *Basic and Language Skills modules* are organized centrally and taken on a fixed date. The registration for these exams is done online via the **Studierendenportal** and has a deadline. All deadlines and dates can be found **here**.

Registration for *individual exams* (e.g. Term papers) is done in accordance with the lecturer. The formal registration is also done on the Studierendenportal.
